MALTA CITIZENSHIP • EXCEPTIONAL DIRECT INVESTMENT

Overview

Avion Citizenship offers professional services to obtain Malta Citizenship for Exceptional Services by Direct Investment. The program grants a European passport, offering the right to live, work, and study anywhere in the European Union.

Investment Options

To qualify for Maltese citizenship, applicants must fulfill **all three** of the following financial requirements:

- **Exceptional Direct Contribution:** €600,000 for citizenship after 36 months of residency, OR €750,000 for citizenship after 12 months of residency. (An additional €50,000 is required per dependent).
- **Real Estate Investment:** Purchase a residential property in Malta for at least €700,000, OR lease a property for a minimum annual rent of €16,000. (The property must be retained for at least 5 years).
- **Philanthropic Donation:** A mandatory €10,000 donation to a registered non-governmental organization (NGO) or society in Malta.

Eligibility Criteria

- Minimum age of main applicant: 18 years old.
- Clean criminal record and successful completion of stringent due diligence and background checks.
- Main applicant and adult dependents must hold Maltese residency status for a minimum of 12 or 36 months prior to naturalization.
- Must provide proof of legal income sources.
- Application must be submitted via a licensed agent such as Avion Citizenship.

Program Benefits

- Right to reside, study, and work in Malta and all 27 European Union member states.
- Visa-free or visa-on-arrival travel to over 190 countries, including the Schengen Area, UK, USA, and Canada.
- Citizenship is permanent and can be passed down to future generations by descent.
- Favorable tax system: Malta has no municipal tax, no estate duty, no inheritance tax, and no wealth tax.
- Family inclusion: The application can include a spouse, dependent children up to 29 years of age, and dependent parents over 55.

Processing Time: Requires 12 to 36 months of documented residency prior to the final citizenship decision.
